Abies concolor 'Blue Select'

Blue Select White Fir

Tall, pyramidal tree with soft powder-blue foliage.

Zone: 4 // 45'H x 20'W // ○●



Acer japonicum 'Green Cascade'

Green Cascade Full Moon Maple

Small mounded tree with a weeping habit. Rounded, palmate, green leaves. Small purplish-red flowers appear in early spring.

Zone: 5 // 6'H x 8'W // ○●



Abies concolor 'Candicans'

Candicans White Fir

Tall tree with open branching. Features intense large, bright silver-blue needles.

Acer Pacific Sunset® PP7433

Pacific Sunset® Maple

Its outstanding glossy summer foliage transitions to tints of yellow, red, and orange in fall. Fine-textured branching and a wide spread.

Acer Crimson Sunset® PP21838

Crimson Sunset® Maple

Foliage similar to that of the Crimson King, but with a more compact and upright form. Flourishes in summer heat where few purple leafed plants will grow.

Acer palmatum

Green Japanese Maple

This small tree forms a rounded crown, growing up to 20 feet with an equal spread. Its deeply lobed, light-green leaves display a nice fall color.

Acer Flashfire® PP23361

Flashfire® Sugar Maple

Flashfire® is a highly desirable maple cultivar offering brilliant fall colors and strong, proportionate branching. Tolerant of a wide variety of climates, it thrives in temperatures as low as -30° but also performs well in warmer southern climates.

Acer palmatum 'Asahi Zuru'

Asahi Zuru Japanese Maple

A medium sized Japanese maple displaying intense variegation with pinks, whites and greens. Bark will occasionally present pink striations.

Acer palmatum 'atropurpureum'
Red Japanese Maple

This medium sized tree with a bushy habit has rich purple leaves in the spring that become deeper purple in summer. Fall brings a brilliant scarlet color. Perfect as a specimen tree or tucked into the landscape.

Acer palmatum 'Mikawa yatsubusa'
Mikawa yatsubusa Japanese Maple

A dwarf Japanese maple with clusters of layered green leaves. Foliage turns yellow and orange in the fall, making it an excellent specimen for a small garden.

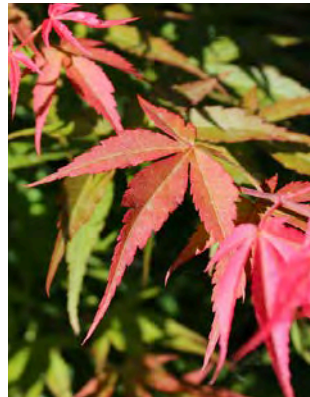

Acer palmatum 'Bloodgood'
Bloodgood Japanese Maple

With a slender, upright, airy form, this tree features large deep-red leaves that retain their color through summer. The foliage turns brilliant scarlet in fall, complemented by interesting blackish-red bark.

Acer palmatum 'Orange Flame'
Orange Flame Japanese Maple

Upright Japanese maple with a yellowish-green trunk and bronze to copper-colored leaves. It displays beautiful orange fall color.

Acer palmatum 'Emperor I'
Emperor One Japanese Maple

Similar to 'Bloodgood' in growth habit, Emperor One holds its red color well throughout the summer months, and boasts a brilliant crimson display in fall.

Acer palmatum 'Redwing'
Redwing Japanese Maple

A palmatum choice that does well in hot, sunny conditions. The summer foliage is an intense red color that changes to purple in the fall.

Acer palmatum 'Fireglow'
Fireglow Japanese Maple

An attractive medium-sized maple with red foliage that emerges burgundy in spring. Its small, lobed leaves turn outstanding crimson in fall. This well-branched tree has a moderate growth habit and develops a broad crown with maturity.

Acer palmatum 'Rhode Island Red'
Rhode Island Red Japanese Maple

This dwarf variety has deep red, almost purple leaves. It is more bushy and round than other upright varieties. Leaves turn fire engine red in fall.

Acer palmatum 'Sango Kaku'
Coral Bark Japanese Maple

Young branches have vibrant coral-red bark that intensifies in winter. Deeply cut light-green leaves display red margins in the summer and turn golden-yellow in the fall.

Acer palmatum 'Shishigashira'
Lion's Head Japanese Maple

Slow-growing variety with compact, glossy leaves that are curled up, making it like no other Japanese maple. The deep green foliage turns golden in fall and is covered with rose and crimson tones, maintaining striking color even in very hot sun.

Acer palmatum 'Shaina'
Shaina Japanese Maple

This dwarf Japanese maple variety has leaves that are dark maroon during the summer, changing to a brilliant red in the fall.

Acer palmatum 'Trompenburg'
Trompenburg Japanese Maple

This fast-growing palmatum selection initially has a vase shape when young, broadening as it matures. Spring leaves emerge red, turn dark purple in summer, and then transition to a brilliant scarlet-red in the fall.

Acer palmatum 'Shindeshojo'
Shindeshojo Japanese Maple

New foliage on this tree retains its bright scarlet color during the first months of spring. As mid-summer arrives the color changes to an attractive red-green. In the fall, the colors become a blend of red and orange.

Acer palmatum 'Twombly's Red Sentinel'
Twombly's Red Sentinel Japanese Maple

Upright, somewhat columnar form. Red, small-lobed palmate leaves turn crimson in the fall.

Acer palmatum 'Gwen's Rose Delight'
Shirazz™ Japanese Maple

Initially vigorous and upright in form as a young tree, it becomes arching with age. The new leaves emerge crimson-pink with white margins that mature into a blend of pink, green and creamy white.

Acer palmatum 'Ukigumo'
Floating Cloud Japanese Maple

Short, multi-branching habit. 'Ukigumo' translates to "floating cloud". The cream, green and pastel pink coloring in its variegated leaves gives the sense of floating clouds.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Crimson Queen'
Crimson Queen Japanese Laceleaf Maple

A low-branching dwarf tree with cascading branches. Its lace-like red foliage retains color throughout summer.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Seiryu'
Seiryu Japanese Laceleaf Maple

Light, bright green leaves in spring and summer. Fall colors are layered in shades of yellow, gold, and orange. It has an upright growth habit.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Inaba shidare'
Inaba shidare Japanese Laceleaf Maple

A dense, cascading tree with rich purple-red dissected foliage. It retains excellent color through the summer and turns bright red in the fall.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Tamukeyama'
Tamukeyama Japanese Laceleaf Maple

Dense, vigorous, cascading tree with dark-red dissected foliage that maintains its color even in the hot, humid summers typical of the eastern US. Leaves are more coarsely dissected than other varieties.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Orangeola'
Orangeola Japanese Laceleaf Maple

A fast growing dissectum selection. New foliage emerges bright orange-red and turns reddish-green in mid-summer. Fall color is fiery orange-red.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Viridis'
Green Japanese Laceleaf Maple

A small, cascading mounded form with bright-green, dissected foliage turns golden-yellow and red in the fall.

Acer palmatum dissectum 'Red Dragon'
Red Dragon Japanese Laceleaf Maple

Dark-purple foliage retains color throughout summer, even in shade. This slow-growing deciduous tree has elegant dissected leaves.

Acer palmatum linearlobum 'Red Spider'
Red Spider Japanese Maple

Upright small tree with horizontal branches whose tips tend to curve down to create a graceful, lacy effect.

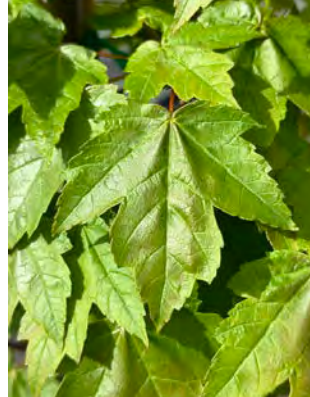


Acer platanoides 'Crimson King'

Crimson King Norway Maple

Star-shaped deep maroon leaves retain color throughout the season. Maroon-yellow flowers and brown seed pods attract birds. It has a shallow root system, so avoid planting near sidewalks or driveways. It is a slow grower.

Acer Redpointe®

Redpointe® Maple

Brilliant red fall color on a broadly pyramidal form. Refined form of the best Acer rubrum cultivars combined with the faster growth rate of Acer x freemanii. A straight and dominant central leader results in strong branch angles.

Acer platanoides 'Crimson Sentry'

Crimson Sentry Norway Maple

An upright, columnar tree with deep purple summer foliage that turns bronze in the fall.

Zone: 4 // 25'H x 15'W // ○



Acer rubrum 'October Glory'

October Glory Red Maple

Moderate to fast growing red maple. Female cultivar noted for exceptional fall color. Attractive red flowers in early spring before leaves appear.

Acer platanoides 'Emerald Queen'

Emerald Queen Norway Maple

Hardy and adaptable, Norway maples are tolerant of many diverse soils and temperatures. This very fast grower features glossy, deep green leaves that turn yellow for the fall.

Acer tataricum 'GarAnn'

Hotwings® Tatarian Maple

Small ornamental tree is covered with clusters of yellow-white flowers in spring. In summer, breath taking red samaras (wings) stand out against the bright green foliage. Drought tolerant and resistant to storm damage.

Acer rubrum 'Franksred'

Red Sunset® Maple

Small, red and yellow flowers emerge in spring followed by dark green summer foliage. This variety is most notable for its brilliant fire engine red early fall color. One of the hardier red maple varieties.

Acer x freemanii 'Jeffersred'

Autumn Blaze® Maple

A cross between red maple and silver maple that provides a great scarlet fall color. Grows well in alkaline soils where rubrums will not. Has the vigor of a silver maple without the narrow branch angles that cause wind breakage. In the right conditions, can grow up to 3 ft per year, reaching maturity quickly.

Albizia julibrissin 'Summer Chocolate' *Summer Chocolate Silk Tree*

Fast growing, deciduous tree has a wide vase shape. Leaves emerge as bronze-green and turn to a rich chocolate-burgundy as they mature.

Buxus microphylla 'Winter Gem' *Winter Gem Boxwood*

An evergreen Japanese boxwood cultivar notable for its winter hardiness. Its small, rounded leaves shift from green to bronze in winter before turning green again in spring.

Amelanchier x grand. 'Autumn Brilliance' *Autumn Brilliance® Serviceberry*

Irregularly shaped small oval tree with white flowers in mid-spring followed by purplish black fruit in the fall. Fall color is in tones of reds, oranges, mauves, corals. Good as a street tree. Attracts birds.

Buxus microphylla 'Wintergreen' *Wintergreen Boxwood*

Handsome, light-green small-leaved form that performs superbly in colder climates.

Buxus microphylla 'Julia Jane' *Julia Jane Boxwood*

Upright, broadleaf evergreen shrub with a rounded habit. Tiny, white, fragrant flowers appear in spring.

Buxus NewGen Freedom® 'SB 300' PP32421 *NewGen Freedom® 'SB 300' Boxwood*

NewGen Freedom® was selected due to its resistance to boxwood blight and boxwood leafminer. Its vigor helps it create an attractive plant quickly, but it also makes annual pruning a must. With annual pruning, this plant makes a fabulous specimen.

Buxus microphylla 'Little Missy' PP24703 *Little Missy Boxwood*

Buxus 'Little Missy' is one of the most popular and beautiful boxwoods. Small leaves, a rounded, dense habit, and glossy, dark green foliage make it unique. It consistently ranked high in resistance to boxwood blight in a 2020 USDA analysis, making it a smart choice in any landscape to create structure and style.

Buxus NewGen Independence® 'SB 108' PP28888 *NewGen Independence® SB 108 Boxwood*

NewGen Independence® offers classic boxwood beauty with good resistance to boxwood blight as well as good performance in boxwood leafminer trials. Similar to Green Beauty in growth habits, but with a more elongated leaf.

Variegated Boxwood

Slow growing shrub with green and yellow variegated leaves. Tolerates shearing well.

**Buxus sempervirens
'Pyramidalis'**
Pyramidal Boxwood

Compact, broadleaf, evergreen with a pyramidal shape. Makes a great accent hedge.

Zone: 5 // 5H x 3W // ○ ●



Buxus sempervirens 'Dee Runk'
Dee Runk Boxwood

An excellent, multi-stemmed evergreen with upright columnar habit. Its narrow shape is ideal for formal hedges or topiary. Slow growing with dark green, small glossy leaves.

Zone: 6 // 8H x 2W // ○ ● ●



**Buxus microphylla
'Bulthouse' PP25896**
Sprinter® Boxwood

Named Sprinter® because of its rapid growth rate, this improved variety of 'Winter Gem' is resistant to boxwood blight. Upright habit is great for low hedging or foundation planting.

**Buxus sempervirens
'Elegantissima'**
Elegantissima Boxwood

Green leaves with creamy white margins. Slow growing with a dense, upright habit. With minimal pruning, grows into a loose pyramidal shape.

Buxus x 'Glencoe'
Chicagoland Green™ Boxwood

Dark green glossy foliage with superior color retention through the winter. An excellent cold-hardy cultivar.

**Buxus sempervirens
'Graham Blandy'**
Graham Blandy Boxwood

Attractive columnar upright form with dark green, rounded leaves and dense growth. Tolerates pruning well for use as a hedge.

Buxus x 'Green Mountain'
Green Mountain Boxwood

Forms a perfect, wide pyramidal oval. Small dark-green leaves excellent for hedges.

Zone: 5 // 5H x 3W // ○ ●

Buxus x 'Green Velvet'
Green Velvet Boxwood

'Green Velvet' is a broad-mounded, compact form of boxwood. Opposite, glossy, dark green leaves are evergreen. Inconspicuous pale green flowers.

Carpinus betulus 'Fastigiata'
Columnar European Hornbeam

Bright medium green leaves are attractive throughout the growing season with little susceptibility to foliar diseases. Foliage turns yellow-orange in fall. Trunks have smooth gray bark and distinctive muscle-like fluting.

Campsis radicans 'Huitan'
Tango Trumpet Vine

More compact than other trumpet vines. Features shiny dark green leaves, set off by red flowers in mid-summer.

Zone: 4-5 // 13'H x 13'W // ○ ●



Carpinus betulus 'Frans Fontaine'
Frans Fontaine European Hornbeam

Great underused tree for planting strips and small gardens. Upright in habit, this hornbeam has small ovate, ridged leaves that emerge a soft medium green and turn yellow in the fall.

Zone: 5 // 35'H x 15'W // ○ ●



Campsis radicans 'Indian Summer'
Indian Summer Trumpet Vine

Woody vine with dark green leaves and clusters of orange-red trumpet-shaped flowers in early summer. Flowers are very attractive to hummingbirds. Takes full sun to part shade.

Zone: 5 // 12'H x 5'W // ○ ●



Carpinus betulus 'Lucas'
Lucas Pyramidal Hornbeam

Narrower even than 'Fastigiata', Lucas' dense columnar shape is cloaked in dark green foliage well into fall, when it turns brown but remains on the tree until replaced with new foliage in spring. Perfect selection for a tall hedge or as a pair flanking an entrance.

Carpinus betulus
European Hornbeam

Hornbeam forms a beautiful formal hedge for landscapes. Leaves are dark green and turn brown in winter. Hardy and tolerates wet soils.

Cedrus atlantica 'Fastigiata'
Columnar Blue Atlas Cedar

Columnar variety of Atlantic Cedar. Strong main leader with all side limbs growing upward. Narrow shape makes it ideal for borders or confined spaces.

Cedrus atlantica 'Glauca Pendula'

Weeping Blue Atlas Cedar

Pronounced weeping habit. Needles are short, thick, and of irregular length. Trained to twisted form. Silvery-blue foliage.

Cedrus deodara 'Divinely Blue'

Divinely Blue Deodar Cedar

Semi-dwarf evergreen conifer with blue green to powder blue foliage. Will perform best in full sun, though can tolerate part shade. Habit is wider than it is tall as a young plant. With maturity, it will develop a more conical shape.

Cedrus atlantica 'Glauca'

Blue Atlas Cedar

Stately, erect tree with lace-like open growth. Silvery-blue needles. Small upright cones form near the end of the branches in the fall.

Cedrus deodara 'Karl Fuchs'

Karl Fuchs Deodar Cedar

A hardy deodora cedar; new foliage emerges blue then turns green. It has an upright habit with pendulous branching.

Zone: 5 // 35'H x 15'W // ○◐



Cedrus atlantica 'Horstmann'

Dwarf Blue Atlas Cedar

Semi-dwarf selection with densely-spaced needles. A much slower grower than the Blue Atlas cedar, growing 8-10' tall in 10 years.

Zone: 6 // 15'H x 8'W // ○



Cedrus libani 'Pendula'

Weeping Cedar of Lebanon

A thin, eccentric tree. Narrow, columnar habit with weeping branches makes this a unique specimen to any landscape.

Zone: 6 // 40'H x 12'W // ○



Cedrus deodara 'Aurea'

Golden Deodar Cedar

Majestic, pyramidal shaped tree covered with golden yellow needles. Graceful, arching branches. Ideal for large landscapes.

Zone: 6 // 35'H x 15'W // ○



Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Duke Gardens'

Duke Gardens Japanese Plum Yew

A compact evergreen ideal for small gardens, low hedges or borders. Easily pruned to maintain a smaller size. The dense, glossy, needle-like foliage emerges bright green before maturing to a darker green color that is retained year round.

Upright Japanese Plum Yew

A distinctive, upright, columnar form. Very versatile as an accent plant or can be trained to form a low hedge. Needle-like leaves are a very dark green.

**Cercis canadensis
'NCCC1' PP27712**
Carolina Sweetheart® Eastern Redbud

Bountiful shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to cancel any order if any trees become unavailable as a result of, or are damaged or adversely affected by, any drought, flood, fire, frost, errors in count, crop growing conditions, or any other cause beyond the control of Bountiful.

2. Acceptance of Customer Order Conditioned on Customer's Assent to Terms Herein. Bountiful's acceptance of Customer's order is expressly conditioned on Customer's acceptance of the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein. Customer shall be deemed to have accepted the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein if Customer accepts delivery of any of the trees. All sales of trees to Customer shall be governed solely and exclusively by the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein, and any additional terms set forth in Bountiful's signed acknowledgment, which terms and conditions shall supersede and prevail over all terms and conditions of Customer's order. Bountiful expressly rejects all terms and conditions of Customer's order and shall not be bound by any such terms or conditions in proceeding forward with the sale of trees to Customer.

3. Price. Bountiful's prices vary depending on the type and size of tree. Bountiful reserves the right to change its prices, and any price quotation made to a Customer, at any time and from time to time without notice. All prices charged Customer are exclusive of freight, shipping and insurance charges, and any sales, use, excise or similar taxes, all of which shall be paid by Customer.

4. Delivery. All trees sold to Customer shall be sold FOB Bountiful's nursery in Woodburn, Oregon (the FOB Point) at which time title to the trees shall pass to Customer. Customer shall pay all freight, shipping and insurance charges; all sales, use, excise or similar taxes; and any and all other costs or charges incurred after delivery of the trees to the carrier at the FOB Point. All risk of loss or damage from any cause whatsoever shall be borne by Customer after delivery of the trees to the carrier at the FOB Point. Bountiful shall, in its sole discretion, determine all shipping dates and delivery schedule, as all sales are subject to crop growing conditions, Bountiful's digging schedule, and availability.

5. Payment. All sales are cash in advance unless credit terms have been approved by Bountiful in writing in advance. Unless otherwise agreed by Bountiful in writing, Customer shall, with respect to all cash in advance sales, prepay Bountiful's invoice at least four weeks prior to the scheduled shipment date. If Customer's order is placed with Bountiful less than four weeks prior to the scheduled shipment date, Customer shall prepay Bountiful's invoice prior to the trees being dug. All Customers desiring credit terms must complete and sign a Commercial Credit Application and, if requested, provide appropriate personal guaranties of payment. If Bountiful decides to extend credit terms to Customer, payment shall be made by Customer in lawful money of the United States within 30 days of the date of Bountiful's invoice. Bountiful shall have the right to revoke at any time credit terms extended to Customer and reinstate cash in advance on further sales to Customer. Customer shall pay a late payment charge on any invoice not paid in full within 30 days of the date thereof equal to 1.5% per month of the unpaid balance, or if said 1.5% is deemed to be unenforceable under applicable law, the highest late payment charge permissible under applicable law.

6. Duty to Inspect Upon Delivery. Customer shall inspect all trees immediately upon delivery and shall give written notice to Bountiful within 10 days of the date of delivery as to any discrepancies between Bountiful's invoice and the quantity of trees received, or any claim that the trees are damaged or defective or do not conform to the terms and conditions of sale set forth herein. If Customer shall fail to give such notice, the trees shall be deemed to be satisfactory, and Customer shall be deemed to have accepted the same and shall be bound to pay for the trees in accordance with the terms set forth herein. Customer expressly waives any right Customer may have to revoke acceptance after the expiration of said ten-day period.

7. Limited Warranty. Bountiful warrants that all trees sold hereunder will be true to name. Customer acknowledges that no other representations or warranties have been made to, or relied upon by, Customer in proceeding forward with the purchase of the trees, specifically no representations or warranties have been made as to growth or livability of the trees, or the results of transplanting the trees after delivery, as growing conditions are beyond Bountiful's control and Bountiful cannot guarantee that any trees will live after delivery. Bountiful's limited warranty shall not be transferable and shall be null and void if Customer fails to pay for the trees in full when due.

8. DISCLAIMER OF UNSTATED WARRANTIES. BOUNTIFUL'S LIMITED WARRANTY IS THE ONLY WARRANTY APPLICABLE TO THE TREES SOLD TO CUSTOMER HEREUNDER. BOUNTIFUL MAKES NO OTHER WARRANTIES WHATSOEVER TO CUSTOMER AND SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ALL OTHER WARRANTIES, WHETHER WRITTEN OR ORAL, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, OR ANY WARRANTIES ARISING FROM COURSE OF DEALING OR USAGE OF TRADE.

9. Limitation of Liability. Bountiful shall not be liable to Customer hereunder for any claim or damage in excess of the purchase price paid by Customer, and received by Bountiful, for the trees. Under no circumstances shall Bountiful be liable to Customer for any consequential, incidental, indirect, or special damages, or any punitive or exemplary damages, arising from, or in any way related to, the sale of the trees hereunder or Customer's use, or inability to use, the same, notwithstanding any failure of essential purpose of any limited remedy herein. This exclusion shall apply regardless of whether such damages are sought based on breach of contract, breach of warranty, negligence, strict liability in tort, or any other legal or equitable theory. No action, regardless of form, arising out of the sale of trees to Customer may be brought by Customer against Bountiful more than one year after the date of delivery of the trees.

10. Force Majeure. Bountiful shall have no obligation or liability whatsoever arising out of or in connection with any delay or failure to perform any of its covenants or obligations under an accepted order, or any loss or damage incurred by Customer as a result thereof, if such delay or failure is caused, in whole or in part, either directly or indirectly, by crop growing conditions, fire, flood, frost, or other acts of God, strikes or other labor trouble, errors in count, or any other occurrence, act, cause or thing beyond the control of Bountiful, which prevents, hinders or makes fulfillment of the order impractical, any of which shall, without liability, excuse Bountiful from performance of the order.

11. Restocking and Storage Fees. If Customer refuses delivery of any trees after Bountiful has dug the same, Bountiful shall have the right to charge Customer a restocking fee equal to 15% of the purchase price of such trees, which restocking fee shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any and all other rights and remedies available to Bountiful. If Customer requests delivery of any trees after May 1st, Bountiful shall have the right to charge a storage fee equal to 5% percent per month of the purchase price of such trees.

12. Off-Season Digging. Bountiful commences digging its trees in the fall after it determines that the trees are dormant and continues digging so long as the trees remain dormant. Bountiful may, if Customer so requests, dig certain trees outside of Bountiful's normal digging season; provided, however, customer shall, in such event, pay Bountiful a special digging charge equal to 15% of the purchase price of such trees and shall assume all risks associated with digging the trees at a time when they are not dormant, including without limitation the risk of loss of the trees after they are transplanted.

13. General Provisions.

13.1 Bountiful has, with respect to all nursery stock bearing plant patent identification, grown such nursery stock pursuant to a license from the patent owner. Customer shall have no right to propagate or reproduce, and shall not propagate or reproduce, any such nursery stock without the express written permission of the patent owner.

13.2 These terms and conditions constitute the entire, final and complete agreement and understanding of the parties with respect to Bountiful's sale of trees to Customer, and shall supersede and replace all terms and conditions as set forth in Customer's order. None of the terms and conditions contained herein may be added to, modified, superseded or otherwise amended, unless such addition, modification or amendment is set forth in writing and signed by duly authorized representative of Bountiful.

13.3 All rights, remedies and liabilities herein given to or imposed upon the parties shall extend to, inure to the benefit of and bind, as the circumstances may require, the parties and their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and, insofar as this Agreement is assignable by the terms hereof, assigns.

13.4 In the event Customer fails to pay any sums owing to Bountiful, Customer shall reimburse Bountiful for all collection costs and expenses, including without limitation reasonable attorneys' fees, incurred by Bountiful in collecting such sums. In addition, if litigation is commenced by either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement, or by reason of any breach of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable costs and attorneys' fees, both at trial and on appeal.

13.5 No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed, or shall constitute, a waiver of any other provision, whether or not similar, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.

13.6 This Agreement shall be governed, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon, without regard to its conflict of law principles. Any suit or action arising out of or in connection with this Agreement shall be brought and maintained exclusively in the federal or state courts in Portland, Oregon. Bountiful and Customer hereby irrevocably submit the exclusive jurisdiction of such courts for the purposes of such suit or action and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive, to the fullest extent permitted by law, any objection they may now or hereafter have to the venue of any such suit or action in any such court and any claim that any such suit or action has been brought in an inconvenient forum.
